

Summary of the event: NSS wings of Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida in association with Dr. Reddy's Foundation for Health Education (DRFHE) organized an online awareness session on "Expert guidance on prevention of Heart Diseases during COVID TIMES" on 23rd July, 2020. Dr. Sujeet Narain (HOD & Senior Interventional Cardiologist, Kailash Hospital) was the eminent speaker of the awareness program. 280 students attended the program.

The objective of the event was to increase knowledge and awareness about Heart Diseases. He advised eating lots of foods high in saturated and trans fat may lead to heart disease. Eating foods high in fiber and low in saturated fats, trans fat, and cholesterol can help prevent high cholesterol levels. He told about proper quantity wise usage of salt (sodium) in diet can also lower blood pressure. He also advised the students to practice Yoga on a regular basis.

He said, five basic lifestyle steps can radically reduce chances of developing cardiovascular risk factors and ultimately heart disease: No smoking, Maintaining a healthy weight, Exercising, following a healthy diet, Improving sleep health.

The students were highly benefitted from the session.

Summary of the event:

Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida in association with **HEDUCATE SOULTION** (Denoting Health and Education) organized an online awareness session on "**Dry Eye**" under the banner of **DGI NSS Wing** on **15th July, 2020**. The objective of the event was to raise awareness about Dry eye.

Dry eye is a condition where the eyes do not produce enough tears or of the needed quality. It not only affects the patient's vision, but also disturbs their quality of life, causing anxiety and even depression, often affecting their professional productivity. The session started with the welcome address of the Resource *Person Dr. Prerna Matta, Glaucoma Specialist, Tirupathi Eye Centre by Dr. Jaswinder Kaur, Faculty of DGI GN*.

Dr. Prerna Matta said that Dry eye syndrome is a chronic and typically progressive condition. Depending on its cause and severity, it may not be completely curable. But in most cases, dry eyes can be managed successfully, usually resulting in noticeably greater eye comfort, fewer dry eye symptoms, and sometimes sharper vision. Dry eye disease can have a number of causes, and a variety of treatment approaches are used.

Dr. Prerna Matta discussed that for mild cases of dry eyes caused by computer use, reading, schoolwork and other situational causes, the best dry eye treatment may simply be frequent use of artificial tears or other lubricating eye drops.

She recommended gently cleaning the eyelids before bedtime to kill bacteria that can cause blepharitis and meibomian gland problems, which can contribute to dry eye symptoms. For at least 20 seconds, apply a wet, moist washcloth to your closed lids. Then, using a gentle cleanser like diluted baby shampoo or pre-moistened eyelid wipes from the drugstore, gently wash your lids and lashes.

She laid emphasis on, when outdoors in daylight hours, always wear sunglasses that block 100% of the sun's UV rays. For the best protection, choose sunglasses that also feature a wrap-style frame to protect your eyes from wind, dust and other irritants that can cause or worsen dry eye symptoms.

Pro.f Vineet Mishra, Registrar, Prof. S.K. Srivastava, NSS Program Co-ordinator, all faculty members and students attended the online session.

Dr Prerna Matta concluded her session by solving the queries of the participants. The online session came to end with the *Vote of thanks by Dr.S.K.Srivastava to Dr Prer*na Matta , *Mrs Sheila (Director) Heducate Solutions* and her team members.




Summary of the event:


The objective of celebrating this day was to draw attention of all towards increasing growth in heart related problems and the ways through which these issues could be curbed.



At the end of the session, the winners were appreciated with a small token of love in the form of prize.







The event concluded with the distribution of Certificates.





S Kumar** said that the dam was constructed in 1977 with majority of work being done manually. Even now the data management system of the dam is effectively run manually. The water is used for power generation at the Dehar Power House before being discharged into the Sutlej River, connecting both rivers with the help of an underwater tunnel of nearly 13Km. After the visit to Sunder Nagar Power Project, the team headed for Manali.




In morning, students were taken to Kullu where they did the survey of undulated area of hilly terrain using Total Station.


Dr. Amit Gupta said that the force exerted by the blood against the walls of the blood vessels constitutes Blood Pressure. This pressure he said depends on the work being done by the heart and the resistance of the blood vessels. Dr. Gupta suggested that the blood pressure is best regulated through proper diet and lifestyle adjustments before it reaches the stage of hypertension.

He laid emphasis on engaging for 30 minutes of moderate-intensity, dynamic, aerobic exercise for patients with hypertension. This he said can include walking, jogging, cycling, or swimming. He suggested to perform regular exercise, yoga and meditation for perfect functioning of heart which would ultimately control Blood Pressure.

Prof. (Dr.) Ashish Soti, Hon'ble Director presented memento to Dr. Amit Gupta and Mrs.Preeti Aggarwal.

Summary of the event: Students of **Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida** witnessed an interactive session "Pariksha Par Charcha" hosted by **Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sh.Narendra Modi** on **February 16th 2018.** The program was organized by **Ministry of HRD, Govt. of India** at Delhi's Talkatora Stadium.

Starting the session, the PM said, "You are not talking to the Prime Minister of India, you are talking to a friend."

PM Modi interacted with thousands of students from across the country and addressed their examination-related concerns. Before he took questions from the students, he said "it was his exam today", and thanked his teachers for whom he is "still a student". "They inspired me to keep the student alive in me," PM Modi said.





When asked about how to maintain self-confidence, he said, "Self-confidence is very important. It's not a pill or herb. There is no tablet that can be consumed for instant confidence. We have to build it every day."

PM Modi recalled when he was student, he read Swami Vivekananda's writings who said that you may have the blessings of all the gods and goddesses, but if you don't believe in yourself, then all those blessings are futile.

He asked the students not to compete with others, and advised parents not to put unnecessary pressure on their wards by comparing them with other children. "Every child is different. Try to find out what they are good at and don't force your dreams on them. Try to be friends with your children," he said. He said that as per the science of war or sports, we need to play on our own ground. He advised that as an independent, separate person, it is not correct to compare oneself with a peer who is a different person. The other person's environment, experiences and growth are completely different.

As far as children of India are concerned, he said, they are "born politicians". "They know how to get their work done."

He spoke about the importance of a healthy balance between IQ (intelligence quotient) and EQ (emotional quotient). "Emotional bonding is essential for your overall development. It helps in forging relationships. Intelligence without an emotional connect is worthless. IQ might help you achieve success, but EQ gives you a purpose in life," he added.

Learn to "defocus" before you can focus, was another suggestion by PM Modi. **"Let yourself loose, do what want to do. It will help you focus."**

He also urged students to "be warriors, not worriers". "Treat exams like festivals" and "a happy mind is the secret of a good mark sheet" were among his other suggestions.

Towards the end, when he was asked by a student if he was prepared for the Lok Sabha elections, he said he was confident of passing his "exam next year". "I have the wishes of 125 crore Indians with me."

Sh. Prakash Javadekar, Minister for Human Resource Development, also addressed the students. He said that the aim of the Govt. is to change the quality of education and the attitude of students towards exams and life as a whole.

The objective of the session was to spread awareness on mental stress and its prevention.

The session was organized in association with the Richmond Fellowship Society (India), Delhi Branch and Mind Piper and was conducted by Ms. Sumita Bhadrige (Community Outreach Manager), Ms. Rashi Sinha (Innovation Manager) from Mind Piper and Mr.Kalimuddin from RFS Delhi Branch conducted the session.





Ms. Rashi Sinha demonstrated simple ways to understand stress. She said that some amount of stress is helpful for motivating a person to work in turn increasing excitement, and improving performance. Excessive stress, on the other hand, occurs when the demands made from a person exceeds the capacities of the person to fulfil them.

Ms Sumita Bhadrige discussed the causes of stress. She said that it could be due to internal or external changes, such as the diagnosis of a serious health problem, changing cities for further studies or staying away from one's family and friends. Stress is experienced by everyone and eachone responds to it differently.

Ms Bhadrige focused on solutions to reduce stress. She suggested many healthy ways to do so i.e., spirituality, physical activity, a balanced diet, and sharing one's issues with someone reliable.

Mr. Kalim Ullah gave a brief introduction about **Richmond Fellowship Society (India)** which provides psychosocial rehabilitation for the people suffering from mental illness particularly Schizophrenia and allied disorders. The aim is to rehabilitate patients suffering from mental illness and integrate them back with the family and community.

The session ended with the Vote of Thanks from **Ms. Ekta Singh, Asst.Professor**, Dept. of Applied Sciences.

Some common conditions they treat are Irritable Bowel Syndrome, Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD), Infectious Diarrhea (caused by viruses, bacteria, or parasites), Antibiotic-related diarrhea etc.

Talking about the pressure of Probiotics, Ms. Bohra said that they are found in foods such as yogurt, while probiotics are found in whole grains, bananas, onions, garlic, honey and artichokes. In addition, probiotics and probiotics are also added to some foods and are available as dietary supplements.

Summary of the event: ASCE Student Chapter of Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida, organized a Survey Camp cum Educational Trip to Pandoh Dam and BCW, Mandi, Himachal Pradesh. The camp was a four day tour to Himachal Pradesh from 14th - 17th March, 2018 for the 21 participating students of VI Semester B.Tech Civil Engineering. During the trip, students visited Hydroelectric Power Project in Sunder Nagar which is managed by Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB).

14th March 2018

The students led by two faculty members, **Mr.Shubhankar Debnath** and **Ms. Swati Verma**, reached Sunder Nagar after their overnight journey. Once freshened up, the team went to BBMB Hydroelectric Power Project. The students were divided into two groups and were accompanied by Assistant Superintendent Engineer **Er. J.P.Gupta** and **Er Manjeet Kaur** who guided them. They were briefed about the working principles of Pandoh Dam. The students were taken to the machine hallway, turbine section and control section of the powerhouse where they learnt practical aspects of Hydropower Engineering.

The guides explained the agricultural and economic benefits of the project, dead storage cleaning process, filtration of suspended solids before entering they enter the turbines, type of turbine used etc. **Er. Gupta** said that the dam was constructed in 1977 with majority of work being done manually. Even now the data management system of the dam is effectively run manually.

The water is used for power generation at the Dehar Power House before being discharged into the Sutlej River, connecting both rivers with the help of an underwater tunnel of nearly 13Km.

After the visit to Sundernagar Power Project, the team headed for Manali.

15th March 2018

The team went for the "Survey Camp-2018" to Gulaba where they experienced heavy snow fall.

Closed Compass Traversing and Leveling were done at Manali. Prismatic Compass was used for the Closed Traversing.





16th March

In morning, closed traversing was done using Prismatic Compass.

17th March

The students went for the sight seeing and shopping. Later the team started its journey back to Greater Noida.





The objective of the lecture was to guide the people about the importance or educating child and to make them know the scheme of the government for girl.



Summary of the event:

NSS Wing of Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida in association with Yakult Danone India Pvt. Ltd. organized a seminar on "Importance of the Intestinal Micro Flora in Health and Disease" and "Role of Probiotics in Maintaining Good Health" on 15th March 2018 at the Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida. The aim of this session was to create an awareness amongst student regarding importance of Micro Flora for digestion.

Ms. Jyoti Bohra started the session with the discussion on the usefulness of probiotics for Indian conditions. She said that Probiotics are live bacteria and yeasts that are beneficial for our health, especially the digestive scheme. People usually think of bacteria as something that causes diseases, but our body is full of bacteria, both good and bad. Probiotics are often called "good" or "helpful" bacteria because they help keep our self-healthy.

Ms. Bohra, pointed out that researchers are yet attempting to calculate out which bacteria are best for certain health problems. Some common conditions they treat are Irritable Bowel Syndrome, Inflammatory Bowel Disease (IBD), Infectious Diarrhea (caused by viruses, bacteria, or parasites), Antibiotic-related diarrhea etc.

Talking about the pressure of Probiotics, Ms. Bohra said that they are found in foods such as yogurt, while probiotics are found in whole grains, bananas, onions, garlic, honey and artichokes. In addition, probiotics and probiotics are also added to some foods and are available as dietary supplements.

The session came to an end with group photograph, distribution of Yakult drink amongst all the participants and presentation of memento to **Ms. Jyoti Bohra** by **Prof. (Dr.) Ashish Soti.**


On the second and final day, **17 March 2018**, the final matches of cricket, volleyball and badminton were played.

Network 18 conducted a one day seminar on "**Gender Sensitization**" on **28th July 2017.** It was organized at **Hotel Radisson Blu, Noida** in association with TATA Tea. **Ms. Gurpreet Kaur, Assistant Professor** (MBA Department) along with 2 MBA students, **Sonal Honda & Shubham Singh** attended the seminar.

The first Panel Discussion was chaired by Mrs. Rashmi Anand, Activist & Member of Crime Against Women Cell. She shared her life experiences. She said that, she re-started her life at 35 - traumatised and fearful. She left a violent marriage of 10 years with 2 children, a daughter, then 9 and a son, then 5. Her beautiful little daughter had become quiet and withdrawn and her son had stopped speaking completely.





Mrs. Anand has published 11 books on human spirit of joy and abundance, of life and death and honoring and cherishing and living every moment of life. She said that she is working with issues of Gender and Domestic Violence, having voluntarily counseled hundreds of women at the Crime Against **Women Cell of Delhi Police** at **Nanakpura New Delhi**, over a period of 5 years.

The second guest was **Dr. Ranjana Kumari** who is a renowned academician and social activist, and is currently serving **as Director of the Centre for Social Research in Delhi**, and is also the Chairperson of **Women Power Connect**, a National level organization of women's groups. Lotus Leadership Award winner (2015), **Dr. Kumari** has dedicated her life to empowering women across South Asia and has authored many well - known publications.

The Centre for Social Research (CSR), established in 1983, is an advocacy group for women based in **New Delhi**, **India**. The group tries to bring attention and justice to all marginalized and underprivileged areas of society.

Both the panelists were of the opinion that **"Gender Sensitization"** should be a compulsory subject in Indian academic curriculum.

As per **Mrs. Rashmi Anand**, boys should also be taught about equal rights of girls. The activities that a child observes at home during his/her childhood have a greater impact in their life.

Dr. Ranjan said that when a child is born whether it is boy or girl, we purchase things as per their gender. As per **Dr. Kumari**, all the citizen of India should understand and have **"Respect of other Human"**.

Tata Tea has taken the initiative and has come up with the slogan "Alarm Bajne Se Pehle Jaago Re".



Name of the event: Workshop on "Master your Mind"

Summary of the event:

On 25 September 2017 DGI NSS wing of Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida organized a workshop on "Master Your Mind". The purpose of workshop was to introduce the concept of mental training and learn "How to effectively manage our thoughts and emotions", "Use work pressure to our advantage and influence our body and mind in a positive way".

Hon'ble Prof. B. L. Kaul, Registrar, Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida, welcomed the guests Sister Priti & Sister Kamla from Brahmakumaris.

Sister Kamla started the session with a discussion on **external stimuli**. She said that the stimuli, **Form, Touch, Smell, Taste and Sound** reach us through our sense organs, which initiates creatures to react accordingly.

Sister Kamla said that the instrument or mechanism within man that receives and processes the stimuli is called the **mind**. If one's mind is not attentive and wanders a person cannot hear what is said to him. She further explained that the mind cannot come to a decision; it only receives the stimuli and then submits it to a higher authority, called the **intellect**; the judging faculty. The intellect judges how we are to react to situations and what responses we must make. The finale decision comes from the intellect.

Explaining the role of intellect, **Sister Kamla** said that every one's intellect comes to a judgement depending upon his impressions of his past life experiences (**samskar**). Past experiences control, direct, regulate, and discipline our present reactions to the world, because our intellectual judgement is coloured by its past experience. If we hold on past in our mind it creates a lot of disturbance for self and others. She advised all to become the master of the self and create a good future with pure feelings and wishes.

Sister Preeti talked about the 5 thoughts - **Positive, Negative, Intellectual, Necessary and Waste**. She said that positive thinking is when the right thoughts are created in unfavourable situations. So far it is believed that thoughts are linked to the environment around us, it's just so natural that when there is a crisis outside, there will be a crisis inside. But spirituality teaches us that what is inside, is independent from what is outside. Negative energy needs to be blocked from the inside. The problem starts when the thought starts driving us instead of the other way round.

She further discussed the basic quality of soul i.e., is **knowledge**, **purity**, **bliss**, **happiness**, **love**, **power and peace**. These basic qualities evolve a pure mind. The purer is the mind, the easier it is to control. Purity of the mind must be insisted upon. Perfect morality takes complete control over mind.

She advised to meditate daily and observe ones thoughts. Throughout the day, one must take a moment to deep breathe.





Hon'ble **Director Prof. Ashish Soti** presented memento to both the guests. He concluded the program with a very encouraging speech, appreciated and praised the guests for the conduction of the workshop. He reiterated the importance of spirituality and advised that the practice of meditation.







Dr. Singh pointed out that hypertension and diabetes are the main causes for stroke. Smoking and consuming alcohol also causes stroke. He said that stroke can be prevented by controlling **high blood pressure**, avoiding tobacco use and leading a healthy life style.

Dr. Singh said that delay in visiting hospital results in delay in recovery from the stroke. One should not delay in visiting nearby clinic or undergoing X-ray or on other routine checkups when required. He also added that the recovery of those affected with the stroke would depend on how soon those people visit the hospital for treatment.

The seminar ended with the query session. **Dr. Singh** was presented with a memento by **Director Prof. (Dr.) S.K Bagga, DGI, Greater Noida** for conducting the awareness session.

C: Courageous and confident.


D: Don't give up.






The students, faculty and staff members were made aware about the "PREAMBLE TO THE CONSTITUTION" as part of celebration.

The objectives of the Conference was to sensitize the participants on issues of IP Enforcement, Piracy, Counterfeiting, Copyright Violation etc. and to deliberate on accessing and using IP information for further R&D in developing new products and processes for developing business strategies.

Prof. D V Bhise, Department of Mechanical Engineering, **Dronacharya Group of Institutions, Greater Noida** attended the conference.

Day 1: 16th December 2016

The conference was jointly inaugurated by Mr. Amit Gupta, Chairman – Education Committee, PHD chamber, Prof. (Dr.) Rekha Chaturvedi, DIPP IPR Chair, Cluster Innovation Center, University of Delhi, Mr. B. K. Sahu, Manager, National Research Development Corporation & Mr. Renaud Gaillard, Counselor for Intellectual Property India & South Asia, Embassy of France in India.

In his opening remarks **Mr. Amit Gupta** stated the importance of IPR in safeguarding the research as well as to protect the applications developed by **SMEs. Mr. Gupta** said that awareness must be spread amongst academicians & SMEs about IPR creation & PAT informatics.

Theme presentation was given by **Prof. (Dr.) Rekha Chaturvedi**, where she highlighted the focus of the conference as**Innovation**, **Invention**, **MSMEs**, **Start** - **ups & Trade**.

Speaking on the occasion **Mr. Renaud Gaillard** highlighted the importance & implementation of IPR from the perspective of France. He added that the special post of IP counselor has been created in universities to spread IPR awareness amongst academia. Coaching services for SMEs on IPR related issues has also been taken up by France government to protect the knowledge. Patent mapping of SMEs must be done to know about their partners & competitors.





Mr. B. K. Sahu, in his overview on the concept of Intellectual Property stated that proper steps should be taken to ease the registering and patent filing procedure. Plenary lecture was delivered by **Prof. Prabuddha Ganguli, MHRD IPR Chair, and CEO, IPR vision. Prof. Ganguli** explained IPR as a natural way of integration with the innovation value chain.

Breakaway Session

The session was chaired by **Prof.** (**Dr.**) **Sudhir Jain, Ex VC SMVD University Katra, Professor, Department of Management Studies, IIT Delhi.** The topic of the session was Roadmap to IPR creation. **Prof. Jain** explained what triggers IP creation is need of humans. Some small but useful inventions were also highlighted like: **Board Pins, Umbrella, Soap Dispenser, Pencil Sharpener etc.**

During the second session the panelists - **Prof. (Dr.) Biswajit Dhar,** Center for Economic Studies & Planning, School of Social Sciences, **JNU, Delhi, Mr. V K Mishra,** Chairman International Affairs Committee on **Middle East, PHD Chamber & Dr. Shashank Mauria,** IP & Technology Management Unit ICAR deliberated on the topic **Trade - Related Intellectual Property Rights (TRIPS) & Emerging Scenario.**

Day 2: 17th December 2016

Ms. Prathiba Singh, Senior Advocate, Delhi high Court delivered the plenary lecture. Ms. Singh spoke on The National IPR Policy recently released by the Govt. of India.

Breakaway Session

The topic of the discussion was patinformatics. **Mr. Raj Hirwani**, Head CSIR's Unit- Research & Development of Information Products was in chair. **Mr. Hirwani** stated that the term patinformatics describes the science of analyzing patent information to discover relationships and trends that would be difficult to see when working with patent documents on a one - on - one basis. The term encompasses all forms of analyzing patent information, including Patent intelligence, Patent mapping & Patent citation analysis.

Mr. Yashwant Dev Panwar, Scientist E, Patent Facilitating Centre, TIFAC added that Patinformatics also cover additional applications of patent information involving a subsequent analysis step. The key underlying property in each of these diverse areas is the analysis step. He emphasized on how IT tools can help in setting up a balanced IPR framework.





The second session of the day was on **IP Infringement & Enforcement**. The panellists deliberated that IP rights are essentially private rights. The primary obligation of protecting IP rights is on the IPR owners who can seek legal remedies for enforcement of their rights.

The conference concluded with the award of participation certificates to the participants. The conference has given a much needed insight to the stakeholders for identifying the practical solutions concerning the creation & protection of Intellectual Property.


